Every Vote Matters

Fall is always a busy season. A new school year is getting under way, work schedules are changing, and all around us we see signs that summer is ending. As we anticipate colder months ahead, we are also hoping for some of the special early autumn days we relish here on the Cape.

This fall, we are also in the middle of an important election season. After the State Primary on September 3, we have nine weeks until the General Election on November 5. Our lives are likely to be busy, full of commitments and obligations during that time. We may get tired of seeing and hearing political ads and promotions for candidates and issues.

In moments when we feel overwhelmed, we may question whether our vote even matters. The answer is yes, every vote matters. The election results will affect our lives, our children's lives, the health and wellbeing of our community.

If we don't vote, we are allowing others to make decisions that will impact us. If we don't vote, we are teaching

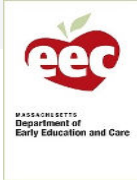
our children that it's not important to speak up, to participate, to use our voice on things that matter to us.

Some years ago, one of the state grants we administered at Cape Cod Children's Place, a grant that helped parents to pay their children's preschool fees, was cut unexpectedly in the middle of winter because of state budget shortfalls. The loss of those funds had a big impact on families.

We invited parents to a meeting, where we explained why they were losing that important subsidy, and we gave out a list of our local state legislators so parents could contact them directly. One young, single mother asked some questions at the meeting. Afterwards she came up and apologized for not being informed. "No one in my family ever voted," she explained.

I think of that mother every election season, every time I vote. I hope she continued to seek information and advocate for herself and her children. I hope she became a regular voter.

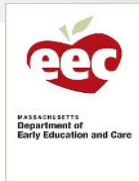

This type of breast cancer is called "inflammatory" because the breast often looks swollen and red, or "inflamed". It's been a long time since I needed to go school shopping with my kids. I miss the excitement and anticipation that a new school year brings. Although the rhythm of the school year is a constant, the details change every year – new schedules, teachers, classes, and maybe some new friends. At our Early Education and Care Center, we have been getting our classrooms ready to welcome in new and old friends on September 3rd.

At the same time, the rhythm of all of our work with families, made by choice, chance, or circumstance, also continues. We offer a home visiting program available in four languages to promote equitable school readiness, free coaching for early education and care providers to foster a culture of resilience, parent-child engagement groups across 11 towns, tailored support groups, individual family consultations, parent education classes available in 3 languages, a peer support program for families impacted by substance use disorders, and assistance with navigating additional community resources.

We will continue to support children and families to build resilience, skills and strengths so they can dream big and thrive. We will embark on an agency strategic planning process in early 2025, equipped with the skills and knowledge we have gained along the way. Cape Cod Children's Place was founded by community members to meet the needs of their neighbors. We are as dedicated as ever to listening to you about your challenges, joys, and hopes for our future. And as our work continues, it is enhanced, as always, through your participation.
