It was a lovely evening, reflective of our ever-changing community. When we opened our doors in 1995, the children in our preschool classroom all lived in families with longtime roots on the Lower Cape. Over the years as people from other places have made their home here, our population has grown more diverse; that change is evident at Cape Cod Children's Place. Our talented staff includes natives of team." Armenia, Macedonia, Turkey, Puerto Rico and Canada, as well as native Cape Codders. The children in our classrooms live in families originally from Brazil, Uruguay, Moldova, Jamaica, Portugal, Romania, Ukraine and Russia, in addition to those with generations of local history. All of us are sharing and learning from each other.

We welcome this rich variety at a time when deadly conflicts in other parts of the world dominate the news and social me-

war zone. We admire and respect those who are surrounded by lethal hostility, yet find ways to maintain friendships and work enemies. A recent newspaper article told of Israeli and Palestinian teenagers in a Jerusalem swimming club, trying to hold onto precious relationships with each other after October 7. With the support of their longtime volunteer coach, they worked through their initial reaction to take sides through angry social media postings, and resumed their friendships.

"We don't think about the team as Israelis and Palestinians," said a Jewish girl. "It is so normal to be together." And her Muslim teammate said, "This is my second family. If we have a problem, we fix it like a

Whatever the news headlines and social media tell us, whatever challenges 2024 brings into our lives, we can start this new year knowing we are all on the same team. Wherever we were born, whatever language our parents speak, whatever foods our family enjoys, we are one community.
